1. *Begins Internally*

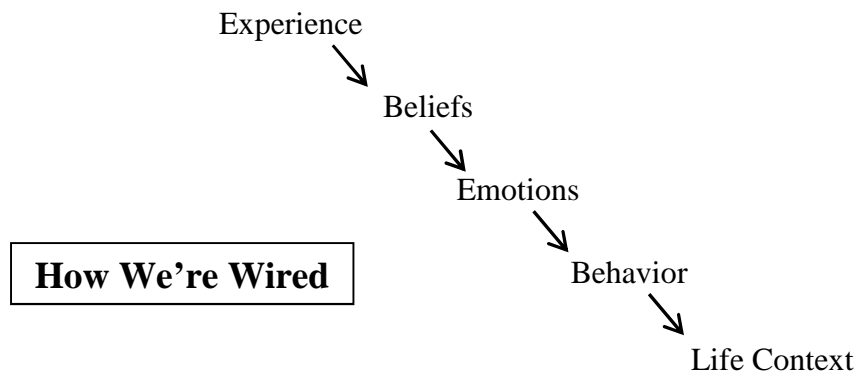
"So I say, live by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful nature." (v. 16)
