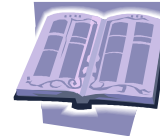

Responding to Grace: Forgiveness...

1. *How It Works*

"The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go."
(v 27)

2. *What It Yields*

"The servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.'" (v 26)

3. *What It Means to Us Personally*

"In anger his master turned him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed." (v 34)
