Johnstown Farm Heritage Day

On Saturday and Sunday, September 27th and 28th, from 1 to 5 pm, the second Johnstown Farm Heritage Days will be held at 5501 Caswell Rd, the farm and sawmill of Joe and Hazel

Almendinger. The Johnstown Historical Society is sponsoring this family friendly event. Admission and parking are free.

Last year's pies from the baking contest went so fast that there is a need for each church to try to provide at least 10 fruit or nut based pies Saturday. The pie baking contest will require that you bring your entry by 12:45 for judging.

Each day Oliver Bigelow will appear and tell his story around 1:30. At 2:00 there will be a musical concert. At 3:00 a tour of the sawmill will be followed at 4:00 of a re-telling of Billy Drago, the first known white man in this area.

Throughout the day there will be crafts to make and buy, chainsaw art of pumpkins and logs, rug hooking, weaving, carving, quilting, soap making, bowl turning, and yarding. Horse drawn rides, games, and crafts for kids are included as well as many last minute surprises.

Food available is by donation only. There will be homemade beans and cornbread, hot dogs, homemade pies, and ice cream. In the large barn there will be tables and chairs for eating and a place to view historical and antique farm equipment. Larger tractors will be displayed outside. We hope for great outdoor weather, but have plenty of indoor space to hold our activities indoors.
